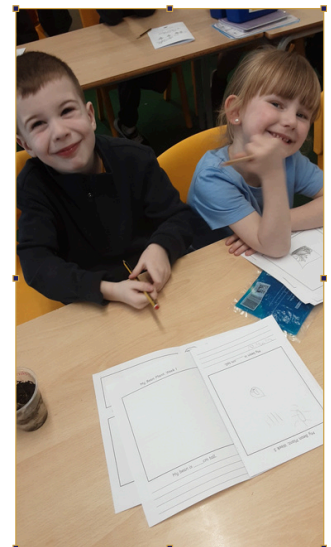


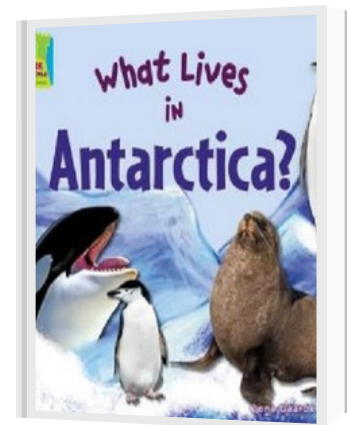
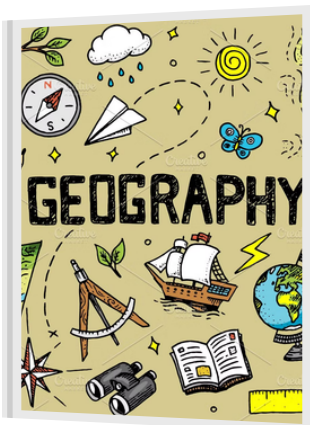
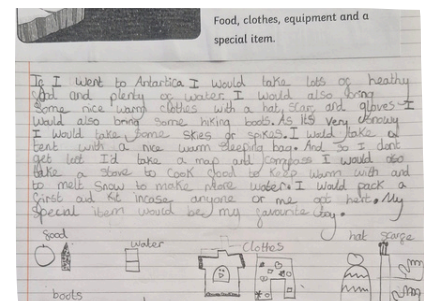
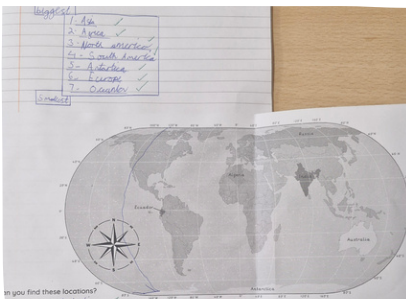


In KS1 we have been enjoying our new Science unit - Growing Things. We have been keeping a close eye on the bean seeds that we planted and have been recording our observations. There was much excitement last Friday when we found some of the seeds had started to germinate! We will be monitoring our plants over the next few weeks and hope to see lots of roots start to appear. We have also 'chitted' and planted some early potatoes, which can be seen growing outside our classrooms in green potato grow bags. We will be taking care of them over the next couple of months and comparing how many potatoes each of the KS1 classes harvest in early Summer.





In our latest Geography unit, LKS2 have been looking at ‘Who lives in Antarctica?’. The children began by recalling the seven continents of the world and have been introduced to the lines of latitude and longitude that run around the earth, understanding that these imaginary lines were created to help people identify a particular global location. The children have then used the atlases to locate specific countries. Following on from this, the learning log activity for the week has asked the children to consider what essential items they may need for a trip to Antarctica!





In our Year 6 science investigation, we explored how to make rainbows using capillary action. We used paper towels, water, and coloured pens to observe how water travels through the paper. By placing the ends of paper towel strips into water, we watched as the liquid moved upwards and mixed, creating a rainbow effect.

Next, we created an air cannon to explore how air moves and the forces it creates. Using a plastic bottle, we pulled back the balloon to push out bursts of air. We tested how the air rings traveled and how they could move lightweight objects. This experiment helped us understand how air pressure and force work, demonstrating invisible air movement in a fun and interactive way.

Finally, we made parachutes using lightweight materials like plastic bags or fabric, attaching them to our backs with string. As we ran, the parachutes filled with air, creating drag and slowing us down. This experiment helped us understand the effects of air resistance and how parachutes work to reduce speed, linking to real-world applications like skydiving and space landings.
