Mathematics

We begin the term teaching the children about number and place value. We will build upon what the children have already learnt in previous years, before moving onto addition and subtraction.

We will then transfer these skills across a range of topics, including, fractions, decimals and percentages in Autumn 2 term.

English

This half-term, our English novel is the thrilling Stormbreaker from the Alex Rider series. We have begun the year creating our own spy stories, remembering to include all the language features, such as varying sentence lengths to really engage the reader.

Next half term, we will be exploring the Victorians through our class novel, Street Child. We will discuss what it was like to be a Victorian child and how they were treated. We look forward to creating an immersion experience, where the children can really get into character - details of this will be available to parents before the October half term.

Science and Foundation Subjects:

We begin the term studying animals including humans in our science unit of work. We will explore the human body and discuss what we can do to keep healthy.

History/Geography:

In history we are exploring The Sikh Empire. Exploring how the Sikh Empire was unified by Maharaja Ranjit Singh and the values and belief system of the Sikhs. In geography we will be analysing why the population changes.
